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Employee Communication: Gender Pay Gap Reporting

We are an employer required by law to carry out Gender Pay Reporting under the Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017.

This involves carrying out six calculations that show the difference between the average earnings of men and women in our organisation; it will not involve publishing individual employees data.

We are required to publish the results on our own website and a government website. We will do this within one calendar year of April 5th 2019.

Hourly Pay Review

Mean gender pay gap in hourly pay	5.7%
Median gender pay gap in hourly pay	-7.1%

Bonus Pay Review

Proportion of males who got bonus payments	93.4%
Proportion of females who got bonus payments	71.4%
Mean gender pay gap in bonus pay	26.9%
Median gender pay gap in bonus pay	66.1%

Proportions of Males and Females in each Pay Quartile

	Male	Female
Upper Quartile	90.3%	9.7%
Upper Middle Quartile	96.8%	3.2%
Lower Middle Quartile	87.1%	12.9%
Lower Quartile	92.1%	7.9%

We can use these results to assess:

- the levels of gender equality in our workplace
- the balance of male and female employees at different levels
- how effectively talent is being maximised and rewarded.

The challenge in our organisation and across Great Britain is to eliminate any gender pay gap.
